We were still holding monthly breakfast meetings at 8:30 AM at the Denny's restaurant just off of I-40 and the Douglas exit on Douglas Blvd.

Dale McLellan was the Broadcast News Staff Editor, putting together for us all of the interesting OKVRC news that was fit to print.

Membership dues were \$12 a year, but then you could buy antique radios for less money then, too.


